They can also learn how to incorporate the feedback that Ally provides to increase the overall accessibility of course materials.

In keeping with the concept of Universal Design for Learning (UDL), course participants can also learn to incorporate automatically generated feedback into best practices when creating and modifying materials using common software programs such as Microsoft Word and PowerPoint.
